### **Action for Children: *Child neglect and its relationship to other forms of harm - responding effectively to children's needs* (2016)**

Action for Children, Research in Practice and the NSPCC published on the potential relationship between neglect and forms of sexual harm and abuse. These different types of harm rarely exist in isolation; children need early, effective and holistic support to address these vulnerabilities, recover from harm and achieve positive outcomes.
